Greetings in the Name of Jesus:

The Church is always at work. Sometimes, churchgoers can get lulled into the notion that Church is that thing that happens on Sunday morning. When we "Go to church" or "participate online" whenever we do that, we can begin to think that is all that church is. The danger in that kind of compartmentalization

is that if we allow ourselves to think about Church that way corporately, we also compartmentalize what it means to participate in Church personally. Once we have participated in worship, we go about our secular lives, until we go to church again next time. Church, the holy catholic church, we proclaim in our creeds, does not begin and end with worship.

Participating in the Church, the community of Christ, is something that happens at least as much, if not more, between Sundays, as it does on Sunday. We come to worship to give God our gratitude for all the many ways God is working in our lives. In the United Methodist Church, we agree to participate in the Church with our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. Keeping this commitment requires us to acknowledge all our God given gifts and abilities and to offer them back to God, so that God can join them with the gifts of those with whom we are participating in the Church. Weekly worship is a testament to the many ways we are gifted as we greet, usher, sing, read, pray, praise, prepare the sanctuary, make coffee, clean, teach, preach, and give of our finances to support the ongoing work of the Church. It is also the time of the week when we give testimony to all the ways God has been present in our lives between Sundays. We participate in worship to empty ourselves before God in praise and thanksgiving so that we make room for what God will give us to prepare for the days ahead.

As an example, I will share a story of something that you helped make possible on a Monday. A family entered the

church on Monday morning looking for help. They were Ukrainian refugees who had entered the US legally and needed to get back to their point of entry for immigration proceedings. They had experienced car troubles, completely outside their control along the way. They had used their resources to make their vehicle safe for travel but needed help with the other things for their journey. Because you gave of your resources, Newburg was able to make a significant contribution toward this end. As a result of the ministries born out of our collective gifts, the Church was prepared to be the Church on Monday. The resources we shared were rummage-sale proceeds that had been designated for just this kind of giving.

We are insulated from the terrible situation in Ukraine. We aren't all of one mind when it comes to the politics of the war itself. But regardless of what we think about the war, the people who are displaced, or who flee for the safety of their families, are children of God. They are our neighbors, whom we are commanded to love as we love ourselves. I wish you ALL could have witnessed the gratitude in this young father's eyes when he thanked us and asked us to pray for safe travels. It was a powerful moment in OUR ministry. You should feel good about your role in helping this family and it should inspire us to help the next.

Many Newburg ministries "restart" in the Fall after taking a break in the summer months. There is always room for folks to use their gifts in worship and in support of the work Newburg does between Sundays. We are also interested in hearing your testimonies as you witness to the work God calls you to between Sundays. We gather in the church to worship, but we cannot do all that is necessary to BE the Church in one hour a week. What is your role? How can you apply your gifts in God's holy, catholic Church? May God guide you toward our collective call to be the Church.

This UNPACKED discussion group seeks to explore the early years of the Christian church, as many leaders of the new church expressed wildly different ideas of the faith, the belief in Jesus and how to worship. We will use a book entitled *The Apocryphal Gospels* (translated and introduced by Simon Gathercole) as our guide for this study while we compare writings that did not make it into the New Testament with those that did. Lectio Divina | Starting September 10 | Ipm | Asbury Lounge

Lectio Divina is a Latin phrase meaning Divine Listening. The practice is a simple spiritual discipline that allows one to have a deep encounter with scripture. In Lectio Divina, the same scripture passage is read four times. After each reading, the leader invites you to respond to the passage with a word or phrase that catches your attention, the feelings the passage evokes, finding images, thoughts or memories that rise in response to the passage, or how is God is speaking to you through the passage. Participants are asked to share these thoughts, but no one is required to share. Starting in September, we will focus our readings on the Psalms. One of the best things about Lectio Divina is that every group meeting is a new start; nothing is carried over from week to week and there is no homework. Therefore, drop in anytime! Led by Dr. Frank Dunbar.

Finance Committee: 2nd Quarter Update for 2024 Michelle Hartmann, Church Council Chair Kevin Canary, Finance Committee Chair

Newburg family & friends,

The Finance Committee gives thanks to God for his blessings and extends our heartfelt gratitude for the continued and faithful support received from all your generous contributions and gifts through the second quarter of 2024! Our total income reached \$274,224, which is \$17,102 more than anticipated. This is a testament to the dedication and commitment of the Newburg faith community, for which we should all be grateful to God. We know that what we are able to give first comes from God who makes giving possible. That we can all celebrate together.

Our operational expenses were \$270,966 for the first six months of the year. We anticipated spending \$294,805, so we have had cost savings of \$23,835 so far this year. In terms of year-over-year giving, we are up \$6,000 over the same time in 2023.

Newburg continues to meet our District Ministry Shares and contributions to the United Methodist Union at 100%. For the Michigan Conference, Newburg has continued to make our General Church Apportionments, which support the Episcopal Fund, World Service Fund, General Church Administration, Ministerial Education Fund, Black College Fund, Africa University, and Interdenominational Cooperation Fund at 100%. Year to date we have paid \$12,451 to the conference for common budget apportionments. This equates to slightly less than 50% of the conference expectations. The Finance Team has committed to "tithing" 5% of our monthly income to Conference Ministry Shares. That 5% commitment is over and above the other contributions we are making. Our goal is to continue to increase the percentage of our income until we have returned to contributing 100% of what is asked of us by the Conference. As the United Methodist Church emerges from the season of disaffiliation and departure, it is critical that we meet our commitments to the Conference so that Newburg fully participates in the reformation and rebuilding of United Methodism in Michigan. Your continued financial commitment at Newburg, will help us reach that goal.

As we move forward into the remainder of 2024, we are committed to providing regular updates on our financial status, ensuring transparency and accountability. We would like to thank everyone for their continued support and for the gifts of your time, talents, and treasures in 2024!

May Newburg UMC continue to be blessed in so many ways!
